PEER & FAMILY SUPPORT

Peer Support Services (18 years and older) allow people to provide knowledge, experience, emotional, social, or practical help to each other who share similar experiences of being diagnosed with a (cognitive and/or physical) developmental disability.

Peer Support Services provide structured, scheduled services that promote:

- Recovery
- Self-Advocacy
- Wellness
- Enhancement of Community Living Skills
- Engagement in Self-Care

Family Support services (up to 18 years) provide love, empathy, encouragement, care and communication to those who have been diagnosed with a developmental disability. Family members learn how to spot signs and symptoms of worsening disorders and how to provide support as they work to manage their condition.

IDENTIFIED NEEDS

The beneficiary has documented identified needs in at least ONE or more of the following areas (related to their diagnosis):

- Acquisition of skills needed to manage symptoms and utilize community resources.
- Assistance needed to develop selfadvocacy skills to achieve decreased dependency on the mental health system.
- Assistance and support needed to prepare for a successful work experience.
- Peer modeling needed to take increased responsibilities for his or her own recovery.
- Peer supports needed to develop or maintain daily living skills.

Peer & Family Support Services are offered through the Centre for Home Ownership and Economic Development with funding from the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services. We will not bill against your insurance, Medicaid or Medicare benefits.
